- Managed and updated a spreadsheet to track and monitor participants throughout the research process for a large cohort

EMPOWER

- Coded and analyzed focus group transcripts aimed at studying social and cultural barriers for undergraduate underrepresented students in research labs as well as science-related education and carriers
- Collaborated on a manuscript which found themes of struggles relate to feelings of imposter syndrome, not belonging, or general worry of underperforming. Findings also indicated faculty mentors emphasized productivity and lab efficiency while disregarding an identity-affirming approach left students feeling greater disconnect. (currently in progress)
- Conducted literature reviews on minority students' reports of feeling isolated, unwelcome, invisible, and distant from faculty, and cultural awareness from faculty members
